

REGULAR SESSION April 4, 2022

The City Council of Gilbertville, Iowa met in Regular Session Monday, April 4, 2022. Mayor Thome called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council members present: Perry, Frost, Brustkern and Becker. Even was absent. Quorum present. Pledge of Allegiance

Rita Becker gave the invocation and Mayor Thome led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Becker seconded by Frost to approve the April 4, 2022 regular session agenda. Ayes – Four. Motion carried. Approve Agenda

Motion by Brustkern, seconded by Perry to approve the following items listed on the consent agenda: a) Minutes of the March 21, 2022 regular meeting; b) Payment of bills, transfers and receipts and c) Appointment of Curt Bovy as Fire Chief. Ayes – Four. Motion carried. Consent Agenda

Isaiah Corbin, INRCOG explained and answered questions on a grant opportunity from Congresswoman Ashley Hinson’s FY 2023 Community Project Funding (CPF) that could be used to help fund the Emergency Response Center. It gives Representatives an opportunity to have projects considered without going through the entire grant ranking process. An application needs to be filled out online, letters of support and a Resolution needs approved stating the city has the funding to complete the project. Motion by Becker, seconded by Brustkern to applying for funding for the Emergency Response Center through the Congresswoman Ashley Hinson’s FY 2023 Community Project Funding. Aye – Four. Motion carried. Fire funding opportunity

Michelle and Ron Weber and Kevin Boldt were present with a request to purchase land from the city that adjoins their property. The land is in the concept stage to be developed in the future and has not been plotted. It was decided to wait to look at the map concept for the area. Request to sell land

Robert Demuth was present to request the vacation of 6<sup>th</sup> Street between 14<sup>th</sup> Ave. and 15<sup>th</sup> Ave. Motion by Becker, seconded by Brustkern to approve the vacation request of 6<sup>th</sup> Street between 14<sup>th</sup> Ave. and 15<sup>th</sup> Ave. Ayes – Four. Motion carried. Street Vacation 6th Street

Mayor Thome opened the public hearing for the proposed FY 2021/2202 Budget Amendment at 7:26 p.m. No written or oral objections were on file. Motion by Becker, second by Perry to close the hearing at 7:27 p.m. Ayes – Four. Motion carried. PH FY 22 Amendment

Motion by Frost, seconded by Brustkern to approve Resolution 2022-05 approving the FY 2021-202 Budget Amendment. Roll call vote. Ayes – Four. Motion carried. Res 2022-05 approve FY 22 amendment

Chief Bovy reported he is waiting on the site design from the Engineer to have the building plans updated to delete the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor and add a basement. Community Protection Building
