The City Council of Gilbertville, Iowa met in Regular Session Monday, April 18, 2022. Mayor Thome called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council members present: Even, Perry, Frost, and Brustkern. Becker arrived at 6:15 p.m. Quorum present.

Sharon Mayer gave the invocation and Mayor Thome led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Perry seconded by Frost to approve the April 18, 2022 regular session agenda. Ayes – Four. Motion carried. Approve Agenda

Motion by Even, seconded by Perry to approve the following items listed on the consent agenda: a) Minutes of the April 4, 2022 regular session and the April 12, 2022 special session, b) Payment of bills, transfers and receipts and c) Clerk/Treasurer Report for March 2022.
