The City Council of Gilbertville, Iowa met in Regular Session Monday, June 7, 2021. Mayor Thome called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Council members present: Frost, Becker, Perry, Even and Meinert. Quorum present.

Motion by Becker, seconded by Perry to approve the June 7, 2021 regular session agenda. Ayes - Five. Motion carried.

PWD Werner reported the section on 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue that was sinking from the water main break has been repaired. There have been major problems with the sewer pumps from grease build up and debris a reminder notice will be put in the newsletter. PWD recommends setting a code for restaurants and business for a required grease trap. The Mayor said he would contact the attorney and see what other cities have for codes and who and how they are enforced. He bought a chemical to help keep the pumps cleaned but it has to be used sparingly, too much will corrode the pipes, it is also very costly.

Deputy Clerk reported that a group of RAGBRAI will be coming through on July 29<sup>th</sup>. Double Take Salon and the Splash Pad committee will be hosting Chris Cakes.
