

REGULAR SESSION June 6, 2022

The City Council of Gilbertville, Iowa met in Regular Session Monday, July 18, 2022. Mayor Thome called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Thome led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Becker, seconded by Perry to approve the following items listed on the consent agenda: a) July 18, 2022 Agenda; b) Minutes from July 5, 2022 regular meeting; c) Payment of bills, transfers and receipts; d) Clerk/Treasurer Report for June 2022; e) 10th Inning temporary outdoor license for August 27th. Ayes – Four. Motion carried.

Consent Agenda

Public Comment – Senator Eric Giddens introduced himself and explained that he represents Senate District 38 which includes Gilbertville and his term ends in 2024. He is on the education transportation and state government committee.

Public Comment

A request was made to repair 8th Street and PWD Werner got a quote to repair the street. Two larger projects were recently completed which depleted the street cash balance. Council decided that they would all do survey of the streets and make a priority list of streets that need repaired and work off that when planning streets repairs. Motion by Becker seconded by Perry to table the request for street repairs on 8th Street. Ayes- Four. Motion carried.

Motion by Becker, seconded by Brustkern to table Quote for concrete at the splash pad. Ayes – Four. Motion carried.

Splash Pad Concrete tabled

Motion by Becker, seconded by Perry to approve a quote for \$1,509 for the fencing between the splash pad and Veteran’s Park the cost to be split between the city and Veterans Park. Aye – Four. Motion carried.

Motion by Becker, seconded by Frost to approve Resolution 2022-15 approving a transfer from TIF LMI to General fund. Roll call vote. Ayes – Four. Motion carried. The LMI funds were from a Developer Rebate agreement and had to be spent on an LMI project. The funds were used to pay for part of a storm drainage project.
