

REGULAR SESSION August 1, 2022

The City Council of Gilbertville, Iowa met in Regular Session Monday, August 1, 2022. Mayor Thome called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council members present: Perry, Frost, Brustkern and Becker. Even absent. Quorum present.

Sharon Mayer Becker gave the invocation and Mayor Thome led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Frost, seconded by Perry to approve the following items listed on the consent agenda: a) August 1, 2022 Agenda, b) July 18, 2022 regular session minutes and c) Payment of bills, transfers, d) Utility Billing Reconciliation for July 2022 and e) Annual Report FY 2021/2022. Ayes – Four. Motion carried.

Consent Agenda

No water/sewer disconnections.

Motion by Becker, seconded by Brustkern to approve Resolution 2022-16 approving the Fiscal Year End 2022 Street Finance Report. Roll call vote. Ayes – Four. Motion carried.

Res. 2022-16 approving 2022 Street Report

Motion by Becker, seconded by Perry to approve the first reading of Ordinance 357 Amending Chapter 75 Off-Road/All-terrain Vehicles, Off-Road Motorcycles and Snowmobiles. Roll call vote. Ayes – Four. Motion carried.

Motion by Frost, seconded by Perry to waive the second and third reading of Ordinance 357. Roll call vote. Ayes – Four. Motion carried.

Ordinance 357 UTV/ATV

Motion by Becker, seconded by Perry to approve Ordinance 357 for the final reading and adopt Ordinance 357. Roll call vote. Ayes – Four. Motion carried.

Motion by Frost, seconded by Perry to approve the low bid from Brock Even Construction for \$7,500 to pour concrete at the Splash Pad. Ayes – Four. Motion carried.

Splash Pad concrete

Discussion was held on the street surveys that were completed and discussion was held on which streets are high priority to be completed. It was decided to wait until spring to make a decision on which streets to complete because winter can be hard on the streets. Discussion was held on applying for street funds from MPO to repair 5th Street and put in new water and sewer lines at the same time. Funding through this program is already out 5 years. It was agreed to look into the Engineering plan to prepare to apply for funding.

Street Repairs

Motion by Becker, seconded by Brustkern to approve that action be taken to enforce the requirements of the Outdoor Service Area license/permit for the Cornerstone Bar & Grill. Ayes – Four. Motion carried.

Cornerstone outdoor Permit

Discussion was held on a request for overtime pay for 2 hours work performed to clean up after Gilbertville Days because the employee had bereavement pay so he was unable to work his normal work schedule. Council felt the policy directs the Mayor to make those decisions and Mayor Thome agreed he would decide.

Reports:

PWD Werner reported the trees have all been removed and everything went well. Hershberger is done at Schmitt Park and seeded has been completed. Don Schmitz & Sons will be back to complete his part of the project.

Motion by Becker, seconded by Perry to adjourn at 6:50 p.m. Ayes – Four. Motion carried.
