

REGULAR SESSION September 19, 2022

The City Council of Gilbertville, Iowa met in Regular Session Monday, September 19, 2022. Mayor Thome called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Council members present: Even, Perry, Brustkern, Frost and Becker. Quorum present.

Janice Rosauer gave the invocation and Mayor Thome led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Motion by Becker, seconded by Brustkern to approve the following items listed on the consent agenda: a) September 19, 2022 Agenda; b) Minutes from September 6, 2022 regular meeting; c) Payment of bills, transfers and receipts, d) Clerk/Treasurer Report for August 2022, e) Trick or Treating – October 31<sup>st</sup> from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. and f) Homecoming parade route - September 21<sup>st</sup> at 5:30 p.m. Ayes – Five. Motion carried. Consent Agenda

Motion by Frost, seconded by Brustkern to approve the low bid from Even Family Tree for \$1,800 to remove a dead tree in City Park. Ayes- Five. Motion carried. Tree quote – City Park

Public Works Director Werner explained the saddle of the old dump truck is rusted off and it will cost \$3,000 to repair. The transmission is bad and the truck is rusting. It is used to haul salt and sand. Discussion was held on purchasing/repairing the truck or having salt and sand delivered. Motion by Even, seconded by Perry to sell the truck and have salt and sand delivered. Ayes – Five. Motion carried. Dump Truck

Chief Bovy reported he met with the Architect to review the plans. He was hoping to have the fee schedule for approval at this meeting but it has not been received. The Architect will be scheduling a meeting with the building committee. Architect/Emergency Services Building

Reports:

Public Works Director Werner reported the fencing at Veterans Park is being installed and Don Schmitz and Sons is completing the storm drainage repairs at Schmit Park. With funds from a grant from MidAmerican Energy eight (8) trees will be planted by the ball diamonds to replace the Ash Trees that were removed.

Chief Bovy reported he has trucks lined up to be in the homecoming parade but no one is available to block streets. He explained that his members already do a lot as volunteers and should not be expected to block streets for parades or other activities.
